As in the past years, the library sponsored summer reading programs for all ages, and it was a busy summer with almost 100 programs, workshops, and activities. To go along with this year's summer reading program theme, "Oceans of Possibilities," Children's Librarian Ms. Kunz read stories about mermaids, sharks, fish, and seashells, and children made accompanying crafts.

Ms. Kunz held programs about Jacques Cousteau, and the children made sea dioramas.



Deep sea divers Alex and Natalya Kitain presented two virtual programs about "Curious Facts from the Deep," sharing stories about their undersea adventures. Because the favorite food of hammerhead sharks are stingrays, Alex Kitain was able to swim very close to this shark!



Other fun activities were Water Games, Outdoor Picnic Bingo, and Kids vs. Adults One-Minute Challenges.

In July, Assemblywoman Michaelle C. Solages held a special story hour, reading different ocean, beach, and sea stories and leading the children in various rounds of "Simon Says." They were also treated by a visit from Sparky the Fire Dog and received their own fire helmets!



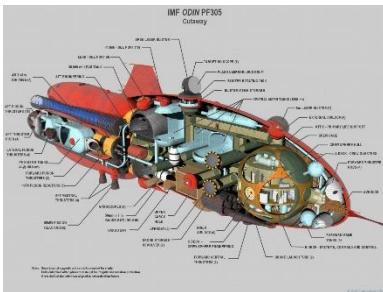

DONATIONS TO THE LIBRARY

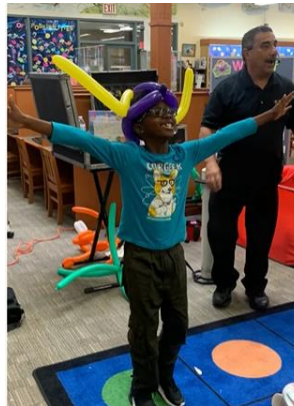

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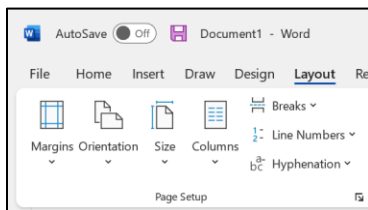

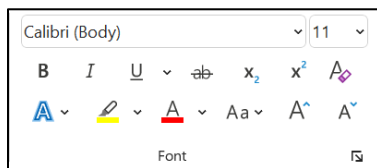
The library will be holding various basic computer classes **via Zoom** on Saturday mornings at 10 am.

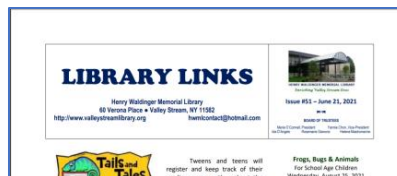

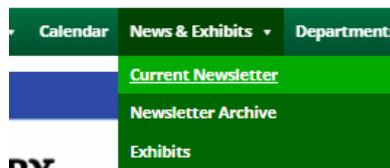

INTRODUCTORY 3D PRINTING WORKSHOP

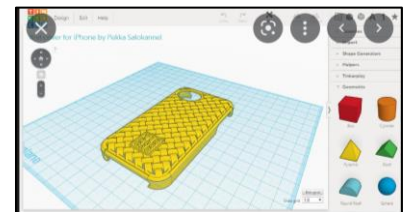


The library will be holding introductory 3D printing workshops on Wednesday, August 31, 2022, at 11:00 am.

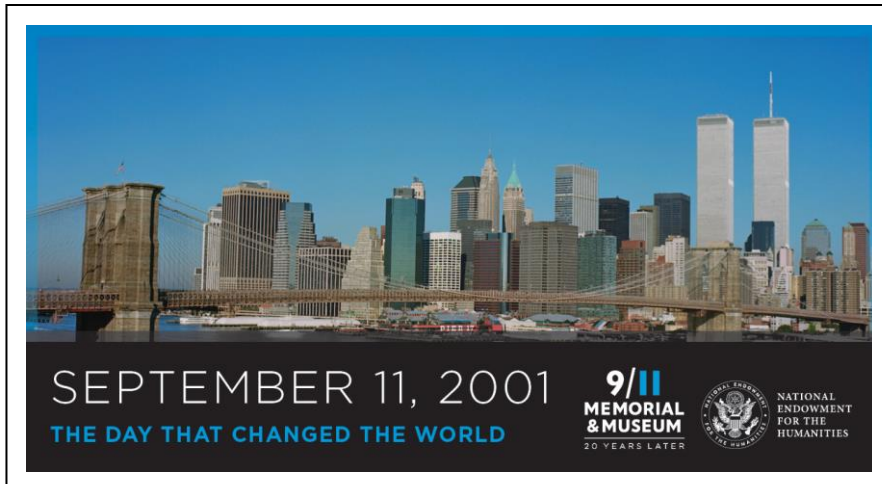

For the second year, the Henry Waldinger Memorial Library is exhibiting *September 11, 2001: The Day That Changed the World*, an educational exhibition that presents the history of 9/11, its origins, and its ongoing implications through the personal stories of those who witnessed and survived the attacks.

Told across 14 posters, this exhibition includes archival photographs and images of artifacts from the Museum's permanent collection. It explores the consequences of terrorism on individual lives and communities at the local, national, and international levels, and encourages critical thinking about the legacies of 9/11.

This poster exhibition will be on display in the Adult Room from September 6, 2022, through October 1, 2022, courtesy of the 9/11 Memorial & Museum.

In addition, the library will be hosting a virtual showing of the 9/11 Memorial & Museum 21st Anniversary Webinar on Friday, September 9, 2022, from 2-3pm.

Hear personal stories from first responders from the FDNY and PAPD, a 9/11 survivor, and a 9/11 advocate. 9/11 Memorial Education staff will be available via live chat to answer questions in real time, but they cannot guarantee that all questions will be answered.

If you are uncomfortable about coming into the library to browse or like the convenience of having your materials ready for pickup, contact the Reference Department and your materials will be bagged for you for quick pick-up in the Children's Room or at the Adult Circulation Desk.



Did you know that you have access to the *New York Times* from 1851-2015 and *Newsday* from 1940-1988 with the library's database, **ProQuest Historical Newspapers**? This database is a definitive newspaper digital archive with full-text and full-image articles dating back to the nineteenth century. It includes the complete paper, cover-to-cover, with full-page and article images in easily downloadable PDF format.

For example, here are the articles from *Newsday* about the Mets winning the World Series in 1986:

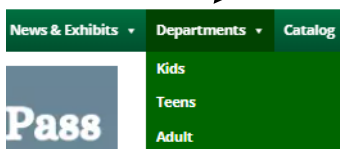

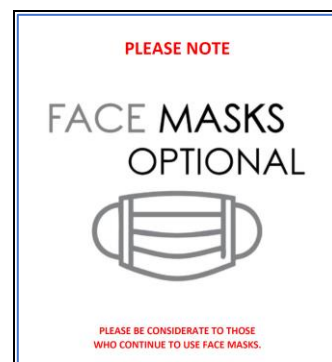


CIGNA WELLNESS BUS VISIT

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WIFI HOTSPOTS AVAILABLE FOR LOAN



The library is pleased to announce that Valley Stream library patrons can now borrow a T-Mobile Franklin T-9 mobile hotspot for a 14-day loan period! The hotspot may be renewed for another 14-day period if there is no waiting list for it.

This WiFi hotspot is a device that you can use to connect a mobile-enabled device, such as a laptop smartphone or tablet, to the internet. It is portable, so you can connect your device almost wherever you are – at home, on bus or train, or in the park. **And when you are on vacation!**

Borrowers must sign a Borrowing Agreement form and provide a valid adult Valley Stream library card in good standing. In addition, as with our family museum passes, all family members must be in good standing as the portable hotspot can accommodate up to 15 devices in your home at the same time.

The late fee is \$5.00 per day, and a \$100 replacement fee is billed after 10 days overdue, plus internet service will be turned off if a hotspot is not returned on the due date.

T-Mobile Franklin T-9 mobile hotspots were purchased with a Special Legislative Grant awarded to the Henry Waldinger Memorial Library by New York State Senator Todd Kaminsky (S.D. 9). Without this grant, the library would not have been able to purchase multiple devices to loan to our patrons, so we are very grateful for his generosity to the community.

Some patrons have taken advantage of the WiFi hotspots when they have had disruptions in their Internet service, when they have been on vacation, or when they have travelled to an area where Internet service is spotty. Remember, there is no charge to borrow a hotspot (if you return it on time) for free WiFi access!

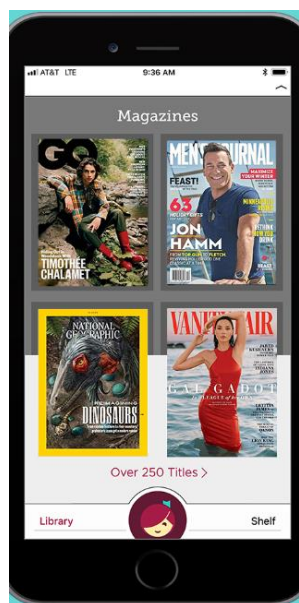
The Henry Waldinger Memorial Library is pleased to partner with other libraries in Nassau County to participate in **WiFi Whenever**. It is a county-wide project initiated by the Nassau Library System to boost Internet access outside library buildings such as ours. The project is supported with federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act funds allocated to the New York State Library by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS).

The Meraki MR86 Wi-Fi 6 Outdoor Access Point mounted on the front right corner of the library building boosts the library's WiFi range by up to 300+ ft., allowing people in nearby housing, on the Village Green, or parking areas to have free internet access whether the library is open or not.

Look for the library's network name in your Wi-Fi settings on your phone, tablet, or computer. There is no password. If you do not see it in your network settings, try moving closer to the library.

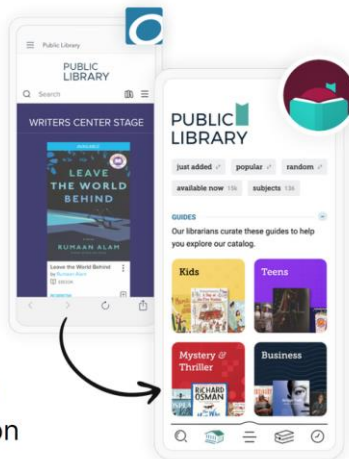

DIGITAL LIBRARY CARDS STILL AVAILABLE

Digital library cards are still being issued for a 4-month expiration period, even though the library is open for library visits and curbside/lobby service. Please note: We recommend that you come in for a regular library card as soon as possible since digital library cards may be discontinued in the future.

PUBLIC ACCESS COMPUTERS & OPACS ARE BACK



The library now has all its public computer stations available for use in the Adult Room, for a maximum session of 1 hour. Two stations are available in the Children's Room for a maximum session of 30 minutes. Patrons can come in to see if a computer is available or reserve a specific time.

Only one reservation can be made per day per patron. Reservations will be held for 10 minutes (which will count as part of the hour), and then the computer will be released to the next patron waiting for a computer.

Due to health safety concerns, the staff will only provide limited computer assistance. Hand sanitizer and wipes are available for patron use.



You can use your library card to sign up for a computer or can be issued a visitor's pass to use a computer. The OPACS (online catalog computers) are also available for patrons to check for availability of materials.

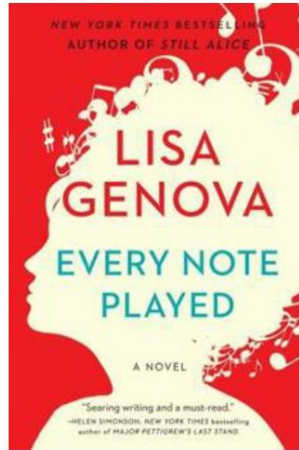

BROOKLYN BOTANIC GARDEN

Brooklyn Botanic Garden is an urban botanic garden that connects people to the world of plants, famous for its Cherry Walk and Japanese Hill-and-Pond Garden.

CLARK BOTANIC GARDEN

Free admission for two

This 12-acre walkable living museum features specialty gardens of roses, wildflowers, herbs, rock garden plants, etc., set among 3 brook-fed ponds, sweeping lawns, and majestic trees.

COLD SPRING HARBOR FIRE HOUSE MUSEUM

**Free admission for up to 6 visitors at a time

This museum is dedicated to the original Cold Spring Fire House, with three fire trucks, plus various photos and memorabilia.



COLD SPRING HARBOR FISH HATCHERY & AQUARIUM

This non-profit educational center features two aquariums and fishing ponds, with the largest living collection of New York State freshwater reptiles, fishes, and amphibians.

INTREPID SEA, AIR, AND SPACE MUSEUM

LONG ISLAND CHILDREN'S MUSEUM

The Society focuses on the political, cultural and social history of New York City and State and the nation. The DiMenna Museum targets children 8-13, with a wide range of family learning programs for toddlers, children and preteens.



NEW YORK STATE EMPIRE PASS

Free vehicle access to most facilities operated by the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation, and Historic Preservation and the New York State Dept. of Environmental Conservation

Empire Pass may be used at Jones Beach, Bayard Cutting Arboretum, Heckscher, Orient Beach, Planting Fields Arboretum State Historic Park, etc. for free vehicle entry (non-commercial), except during special events.



NEW YORK TRANSIT MUSEUM

Free admission for 2 adults and up to 2 children

Housed underground in an authentic 1936 subway station in Downtown Brooklyn, the Transit Museum's working platform level spans a full city block and is home to a rotating selection of twenty vintage subway and elevated cars dating back to 1907. Visitors can board the vintage cars, sit at the wheel of a city bus, step through a time tunnel of turnstiles, and explore changing exhibits that highlight the cultural, social and technological history – and future – of mass transit.



OLD BETHPAGE VILLAGE

RESTORATION & THE MUSEUM OF AMERICAN ARMOR (April – December ONLY)

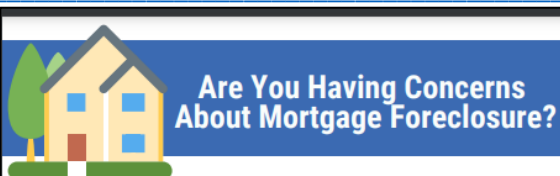


NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH'S NEW WIC VIRTUAL ASSISTANT

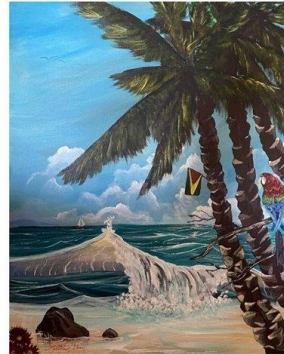
